- 9:30 a.m. Leave from Cargill, 15407 McGinty Road West, Wayzata. Load in the Employee Parking lot in the back of the building. Bus entrance (1st entrance in rear of building.)
- 10:15 a.m. Meet Ole & Lena. They are costumed character guides from Minnesota's Scandinavian Past. Set out on a riding tour to discover how and why immigrants from Norway, Sweden, Denmark and Finland came as pioneers to St. Paul and Minneapolis. Learn about sites such as the Mindekirken Church and the Norway House. See the famous statue of Leif Erickson and other sights, as you learn about the Twin Cities Scandinavian Heritage.
- 12:15 p.m. Drop off Ole & Lena.
- 12:30 p.m. Have a traditional Swedish lunch in this European atmosphere. Menu: Meatballs, Gravy, Potatoes, Rye Bread with Butter, Beet Salad, Cucumber Salad, Dessert and a Beverage.
- 1:30 p.m. After lunch, spend time in the Bokhandel Gift Shop with Swedish Crystal and Glass, Art and Design, Crafts, Collectibles, Jewelry, Books, Music, Scandinavian Kitchen Items, decorations, candy and more.
- 2:00 p.m. Take a guided tour of The Turnblad Mansion and the American Swedish Institute. Step back in time and experience the exquisite 33-room mansion, including detailed wood carvings, sculpted ceilings, and hand-crafted Swedish tile stoves. Learn about the fascinating Turnblad family, the art and architecture of the mansion, and the history of early Minneapolis. In 1908, the Turnblads, a Swedish immigrant family, completed the construction of their castle-like mansion. Twenty-one years later, they gave it all away to the community, founding the museum and cultural center that would become the American Swedish Institute. Today, the American Swedish Institute is a place to learn about and experience Swedish, Swedish-American, and Nordic culture, learn about the role of Swedish and other immigrants in Minnesota's history.
